Reactions by viewers range from optimism to a deep-rooted sadness. The strongest responses came after viewing a *Superman* episode's depiction of an "evil medicine man" who uses a ceremonial pipe to kill a warrior. The significance of First Nations peoples' responses and reactions are both surprising and profound. After publication of *"Indian" Stereotypes in TV Science Fiction*, ignorance can no longer be used as an excuse for Hollywood's irresponsible depiction of First Nations peoples' culture, traditions, elders, religious beliefs, and sacred objects.
